


1 In this project you're going to make a zoo website! Go to [dojo.soy/mini-trinket](https://dojo.soy/mini-trinket) and click **Remix**. You will need to be signed in to Trinket. After you've clicked **Remix**, click the **Save** button.

2 Click on your username at the top right of the screen and select **My Trinkets**. Find the project you just created, called "WebPictures Remix", and click to open it.

3 In the **code pane** go to the tab `styles.css`. There you can see what colours will be used on the website. The text colour is `color` and the background colour is `background-color`. Change the values to colours that you like. For a list of colour names you can use, see [dojo.soy/mini-web-colours](https://dojo.soy/mini-web-colours).

4 For the next step you'll need a picture of a zoo animal that you like. It needs to be saved on your computer. If you don't have one handy, you can search the internet and download a picture, or even draw one.

5 Click the image icon to the right of the code tabs, then **Add Image**, then **Upload**, then **Click To Select Files**. Find the picture file on your computer, select it and click **Open**. Click **Done**.



6 Now click on the `index.html` tab, and add the following line of code on a new line after the last `</p>` tag.

```

```

- Change `lions.jpg` to the filename of your picture. It must match the file name exactly. The picture should appear on your page.

7 If you want to change the size of your picture, go to `styles.css`. The rules for pictures are in the `img` block:

```
img {
  width: 200px;
}
```

Change the number after `width`. If you delete any of the other letters or symbols, be sure to type them back in! It should look like this: `width: 450px;`

8 Let's turn it into a link that takes you to a page all about the animal! First, create a new page: click the **+** next to the image icon and type `lion.html` where it says **file name**.

- You can change it to whatever animal you have, but be sure the name ends in `.html` as this is what makes it a **web page**.

9 Go to the file `blank_page.html`. There you'll see all the code you need for a blank page. Copy that into your new file.

**10** To add a paragraph of text, click in the blank space between the `<main></main>` tags and type `<p></p>` . Type your text in between the tags, like this: `<p>This page is all about lions!!!!</p>` . You can add as many paragraphs like this as you want.

- o Try adding some pictures on this page too!

**11** Go back to `index.html` . Find your image code and put it in between a pair of `<a></a>` tags like this:

```
<a href="lion.html"></a>
```

Change `lion.html` to the name of the new page you created.

**12** You just turned your picture into a link! You should be able to click on the picture now and see the page about that animal.

**13** On a new line underneath your image and link code, write some more code to show another picture that links to another new page. Don't forget to upload a file for your picture and create a new page! Add as many pictures and pages as you like. What animals are in your zoo?

**14** Don't forget to click on **Save** every now and again to make sure you don't lose any of your work.
